What does CERT do?

CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) is a program that educates volunteers about disaster preparedness for the hazards that may impact their area. It also provides training in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

Key Talking Points About CERT:

- 1. <u>Disaster Preparedness</u> CERT members learn how to prepare for potential disasters specific to their communities, ensuring they can protect themselves and help others during emergencies.
- 2. <u>Support to First Responders</u> CERT volunteers can support local emergency services by providing immediate assistance to victims and managing hazards in their neighborhoods when professional responders are delayed.
- 3. <u>Increased Community Resilience</u> By having trained volunteers spread throughout a community, CERT helps create a more resilient population capable of responding to a variety of emergencies before, during, and after the arrival of professional first responders.
- 4. <u>Basic Response Skills</u> Volunteers learn skills such as first aid, fire suppression, and search and rescue, enabling them to assist in times of crisis and reduce the demand on professional emergency responders.

- 5. <u>Community Involvement and Engagement</u> CERT promotes community cooperation and engagement, fostering a spirit of volunteerism. It brings people together and builds stronger, more connected neighborhoods that are better equipped to handle emergencies.
- 6. <u>Leadership and Coordination</u> CERT provides a structure that allows for organized disaster response efforts, enabling community members to take on leadership roles and manage small groups of volunteers during times of need.

In summary, the CERT program helps communities become more self-reliant during disasters and emergencies, allowing residents to help themselves and others until professional help arrives. It's about taking care of each other!

What Should New Members Know?

New CERT members should understand that the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is a volunteer-based program that empowers community members to assist in emergency situations. Here are key things they should know:

- <u>Training and Skills</u>: CERT members receive training in disaster preparedness, fire safety, basic medical
 care, light search and rescue, and team organization. These skills allow members to help their families,
 neighbors, and first responders during emergencies.
- Role in Emergencies: During a disaster, CERT members may be called upon to provide support when professional responders are delayed or overwhelmed. They help by providing immediate assistance to victims, organizing volunteers, and supporting the overall emergency response.
- <u>Commitment to Safety</u>: CERT prioritizes the safety of its volunteers. Members are trained to assess situations and assist within the scope of their training, ensuring they do not put themselves in danger.
- Ongoing Involvement: Beyond the initial Basic Training, CERT offers additional training opportunities

 stay prepared for future emergencies.

The Importance of CERT Basic Training

In times of disaster or emergency, first responders such as firefighters, paramedics, and police officers are often overwhelmed with calls for assistance. That's where Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Basic Training comes in. This vital program empowers everyday citizens with the skills and knowledge they need to support emergency services and help their communities during critical times when professional help might be delayed.

What is CERT Basic Training? CERT Basic Training is an intensive course designed to prepare individuals to handle a variety of emergencies. Participants are trained in essential life-saving skills such as disaster preparedness, basic first aid, fire safety, light search and rescue, and team organization. This training is invaluable in situations where individuals may be trapped or injured but professional rescue services have not yet arrived.
- 5. <u>Team Organization</u>: Working as a team is a cornerstone of the CERT program. Trainees learn how to organize volunteers, communicate effectively in high-stress environments, and lead efforts in managing a coordinated response to disasters.

Why is CERT Basic Training Important? In an emergency, CERT-trained individuals can make a significant difference in reducing injuries, preventing fatalities, and helping to maintain order. They act as an essential link between professional responders and the community by providing immediate assistance and helping ensure that critical needs are met until additional help arrives. CERT members are also trained to assess situations and act within the scope of their training, ensuring their own safety while assisting others.

What's a Constable?
